-Dryden Dairy Day is this Saturday, June 11th. Tradition has been that Dryden Kiwanis Ball Players march in the parade. This year, I would like to see the greatest turnout we have ever had. Please plan on having your ball player march this year in the Dryden Dairy Day parade. The Dairy Day organizers would like to see children, parents and coaches getting in line shortly after 8:30 AM. The line-up starts at the Cattle Sale Barns next to the old town hall on East Main St (Virgil Rd). I have been told that East Main St. will be shut off on the morning of the parade. It is recommended that you park at Dryden Elementary School and walk over to the line-up site. The parade starts at 9:30 AM sharp and ends at the back entrance (Elm Street side) of Montgomery Park. If you are not walking in the parade with your children, this is where you would pick them up.

-Dryden Kiwanis plans to offer Summer Ball again in 2011. We will offer summer play at the Major League level of Softball as we have in years past (please see your coach for a signup form), and all levels of baseball except the major league level and T- Ball. We will once again offer our free sandlot ball program at the Groton Ave fields that will be open to 1st to 3rd graders. Our new summer developmental baseball program for 9-11 year olds information form is enclosed. This new program is designed for those ball players not wanting the rigors of travel ball. Summer ball's success is contingent upon a large number of participants showing interest in playing.

- Please remember that players in the **Triple A and Major League Baseball program must wear baseball pants or long pants.** For safety reasons shorts are not allowed.

-Just a reminder to parents and spectators that the local School Grounds and Municipal Parks that we use do not allow the consumption of any type of tobacco or alcohol product on premises. They also do not allow animals - wild or domestic (dogs), to be brought to sporting events. Please respect their rules so we may play there next year, particularly at the High School.
